Pennsylvania National Horse Show Tickets On Sale Now Over 20,000 Spectators Expected At Ten Day Event

Harrisburg, PA—Organizers are making final preparations for the 66th Annual Pennsylvania National Horse Show, which runs from October 13th to 22nd at the Pennsylvania Farm Show Complex and Expo Center in Harrisburg. General Admission tickets are now available online at www.PAnational.org/event-tickets. Reserved Seating tickets are available only for the October 22nd Grand Prix by phone at 717-770-0222. Both General Admission and Reserved Seating tickets are available at the door.

Tickets are selling quickly with over 20,000 spectators expected to attend the largest indoor horse show in the U.S. The show's schedule is full of exciting competitions and events, including Guy McLean, Australia's most extraordinary entertainer and horseman, who will appear October 19th through 22nd. In addition to competitive events and performances, over 50 vendors with distinctive items can be found on the main concourse providing a wonderful boutique shopping experience. Shoppers will find jewelry, unique gift items, antiques and apparel. All shops are open from 11:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. each day.

Parking is free. General Admission tickets for the first nine days of the show – October 13 – 21 - are \$10 for regular adult admission and \$5 for students and seniors (over 65). Children under 6 are free in General Admission seats. On Grand Prix Saturday, October 22nd, adult general admission seats are \$20 and \$10 for students and seniors. Reserved seats for the evening session, which also allows all day admission, are available at \$50, \$40 and \$25. Reserved seats can be purchased by calling the show office, 717-770-0222 on Monday through Friday between 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.

The Pennsylvania National Horse show is celebrating its 66th year. One of the largest indoor horse shows in the U.S., the event hosts horses and competitors from across the country and spectators from throughout the Mid-Atlantic. The Pennsylvania National Horse Show has donated over \$1.4 million to equine-related charities since its inception in 1945.
